HAVE AGREED to the following terms and conditions,

1. The student commits him/herself to duly attend the prescribed lectures/ sessions and examinations of the course as specified in Annex 1.
2. The student agrees with the general terms of delivery, including the participation costs to the course (annex 2). These participation costs include any compulsory administrative and operational costs related to the participation of the Student in the course (e.g. admission, registration, university tuition, course exams, thesis examination, library and computer access, insurance coverage etc.). The insurance scheme selected by the UT covers adequately the Student in case of accident, injury, and hospitalisation while participating in the programme. Any other cost that may be charged in addition (e.g. for participation in fieldwork activities) being compulsory or voluntary, are communicated to the Student at the application stage.
3. Under the present Agreement, the Student is obliged:
 - To obtain his/her resident permit from the National and local Authorities upon his/her arrival;
 - To participate in the orientation and welcome meetings as well as the informative and official meetings and events;
 - To attend assiduously, and with the objective of successfully passing, the courses, seminars, and the thesis inherent in the programme of studies
4. All important details on the study programme such as the study and examination regulations, the curriculum, the nature of exams, the use of the ECTS grading system, the conditions under which the student is considered to be underperforming etc. are provided by the UT/ITC through the Study Guide and Assessment Regulation (MSC) which is available on the web pages: <http://www.itc.nl/study>.
5. The student Agreement does not create or entitle an employer-employee relation between the University and the Student.
6. Any alteration to the present Agreement or respective Annexes must be communicated in writing. All alteration to the initial situation must be immediately communicated by the Student to the course director of the UT (faculty ITC). Upon mutual agreement of contractual modifications, ITC issues an addendum to the present Agreement.
7. Any deliberate failure of the part of the Student to fulfil the conditions expected in terms of attendance at the programme, in particular no-fulfilment of the conditions stipulated in the present Agreement, constitutes sufficient reason for action to be taken towards resolving the issue and could led to het exclusion of the Student from the programme (and the reimbursement of the scholarship award if applicable).
8. In case of exclusion or withdrawal of the Student from the programme on his/her own decision or by force majeure, the Student is responsible to reimburse the scholarship / pay for all his/her financial obligations, in particular the rent, bank fees, etc.
9. Without prejudice to the general consequences laid down in national law applicable in the present Agreement, UT/ITC reserves the right to cease the effects of the present Agreement, without recourse to any juridical procedure apart from adequate communication to the Student.

10. Failing agreement by both parts, the Dutch courts are designated as the only competent authority to resolve any legal dispute between the Institution and the Student emerging from the agreement. The present agreement will be governed by Dutch Law.
11. UT/ITC are exonerated from any responsibility for accidents, illness, and injuries, losses of damages to persons or goods resulting from or in any way related to the activities that are object of the present Agreement. The student is obliged to accept the necessary insurance related to the activities for the full duration of the study period.

ANNEX 3: MSc in Geo-Information Science and Earth Observation for Environmental Modelling and Management (GEM)..

EM Scholarship and Logistical Information

- Erasmus Mundus scholarship recipients are expected to have read and understood the scholarship award criteria, including the refund policy (<http://www.gem-msc.org/>)
- Erasmus Mundus scholarship recipients will receive a separate grant award letter issued by the coordinating institution specifying grant related information
- Erasmus Mundus scholarship recipients will be paid a monthly grant by the lead institution (UT/ITC) as specified in the financial budget (annex 2)
- Actual expenses exceeding the financial budget amount will be covered by the student.
- The host institutions will arrange accommodation, if requested by student, for the time indicated and in accordance with institutional policy
- The first host institution has the responsibility to assist the student with all visa requirements for the first period of study, and the second host institution has the responsibility to assist the student with all visa requirements for second period of study
- Transportation between host institutions and health insurance will be arranged by UT/ITC
- The host institutions will assist with the logistical arrangements for student fieldwork, if applicable

Orientation and Student Services

- The host institutions will provide a comprehensive orientation program into the host culture and university
- Students receive student support services and pastoral care for the duration of their study. For detailed information of these services per institution, visit the GEM website at: <http://www.gem-msc.org/>
- A language course will be arranged by the host institution as appropriate

Academic Support and Appeals Process

- Students receive a course handbook and/or syllabus in regards to the course. The handbook and/or syllabus gives an overview of the different modules, learning outcomes, delivery methods (lectures, practical, group work, fieldwork, etc.), examination regulations as well as the start- and end dates of different modules
- If a student fails to make adequate academic progress according to the examination regulations, s/he will receive written notice of this fact
- If after the written notice sufficient academic improvement is not observed, the host institution reserves the right to withdraw the student from the study program
